The new Career and Technical Scholarship (CTS) application is now open!

The CTS scholarship was created to help fill trade, health care and STEM workforce shortages around our state. The scholarship provides \$1,500 in flexible scholarship funding for students attending community and technical colleges. Funding can be used to cover tuition, fees and other costs of attendance such as living expenses, food and more. Plus, students get access to exclusive WSOS support services.

Students can use these funds to pursue an associate's degree, certificate or apprenticeship from one of Washington's 34 community and technical colleges. We are building pathways to the careers our state needs most such as nursing, welding and information technology: Nearly 1,000 trade, health care or STEM programs are eligible for CTS funding across Washington state.

To be eligible, students must:

- Enroll at an eligible Washington state community or technical college in fall 2019.
- Enroll in an eligible certificate, apprenticeship or associate's degree program leading to a high-demand trade, health care or STEM occupation.
- Obtain a Washington state high school diploma or GED.
- Have a total family income that does not exceed 125% of the Washington state median family income.

Fall 2019 applications are due by July 12, 2019 at 11:59 p.m. The application will open again in November 2019 and February 2020 for students enrolling in winter and spring quarters. WSOS will select 550 CTS recipients for the 2019 - 20 academic year.
